# Who Let the Dogs Out?

with **dogs running loose** in the are temporarily suspended. neighborhood, sometimes in 2s and 3s. Whether they're getting out of a hole in the fence or zipping through an open door, they're a hazard to themselves, yards, children, and other dogs.

Dogs can act very differently outside, or cold night. when running with other dogs. A dog that's on a leash is often very nervous around one (or a pack) that is free, and loose dogs are often aggressive with leashed ones. This situation has led to attacks and dogfights right here in Deerbrook.

# **Don't Forget to Care for your Yard this Winter**

Although this is typically the time of year when plants stop growing, that doesn't mean we can forget about our yards. Leaves and pine needles have and are falling, and we need to keep cleaning them up. Remember to have the pine needles occasionally cleaned off your roof and out of your gutters to make them last longer.

Please don't blow your pine needles and yard debris into the road. Not only

does it look bad to your neighbors and our visitors, but as we learned last year when the county blocked the roads while they made repairs, it also clogs up our storm drains.

If you haven't already, this is the time to prune your rosebushes and deadhead large flowers. It is really too late to plant seeds or bulbs outside, but a great time to start growing seeds indoors to plant in the spring.
