The May 11 General Meeting that Almost Didn't Happen


Our bylaws require us to have 20% of the membership present to conduct a general meeting. On May 11, this almost didn't happen due to the scarcity of members. We started 22 minutes late after two non-member households arrived and paid their dues on the spot. Thank you very much to them!

The majority of our spending in the past year - over 52 households' worth of membership dues - was spent to keep our front entrance beautiful (see graph). As this is such an important part of our spending and our community image, a Landscaping Committee was started at this meeting with the goal of investigating ways to keep our frontage competitive with new neighborhoods nearby. Spending and budget were discussed, as were abandoned properties. The same officers were re-elected, in the same positions. There were no new volunteers for the Board. Due to losses last year, we still need 3 to 4 new Board members.

The Dark Days of Deerbrook

It was in 2002 that the bills barely got paid. No Board meetings were held. Naydeen London, the Secretary-Treasurer, paid pills with dues from the year before. Board members were frustrated because HOA busi-



ness was not being carried on as demanded by the Bylaws, and called an emergency General Meeting on November 7. Quite a few concerned people attended the meeting and volunteers were appointed to the positions that had been inactive. Since dues hadn't been collected that year, the new Officers and a

number of other attendees paid their dues on the spot. It wasn't clear why it had happened, but the HOA nearly disappeared. A number of residents, new and old, came together and saw what could happen when apathy reached the critical point. Of those people who signed up that night, most have remained active in the HOA in some capacity ever since. But they are reaching 10 and 12 years with their service. Some of them have done a great deal to support the neighborhood and our property values; others have moved out. Your HOA needs you now.

Burning ban still on till Sept 30

Just a reminder that outdoor fires aren't allowed during the summer. After October they're allowed during the day only; anything that causes thick dark smoke can't be burned. Outdoor fires are banned on Sundays, windy days, during air pollution episodes, fog, rain, the passage of cold fronts, and other hazard days.
