Cars and Children: A True Story

One of my saddest evenings working in the Emergency Room involved a teenager. He came in DOA after being slammed by a car that had drifted to the right. Handsome and athletic, he had been hit from behind. I will spare you the details, but I will never forget that he wore a navy blue jogging outfit. The accident had happened shortly after sunset.

I knew that this was a senseless death. If he'd been walking on the left side of the road, wearing light colors, I think he'd be alive today. Didn't his Mom tell him what my Mom had drilled into me? It was too late for him, but realized after I moved into Deerbrook that the young man wasn't alone in underestimating his risk when walking on a road without sidewalks.

Most children believe that if they can see a car, the driver can see them. Experienced drivers know that this cannot be counted on due to low light, glare, blind spots, contact lens slippage, and the occasional bee in the car. Not to mention cell phones, screaming toddlers, blinding headaches and getting dust in your eyes. And drunk drivers, whose existence I would prefer to forget. It is important that kids know these things can happen, and how to keep themselves safe.

Teach children to walk on the left, facing traffic, even in daylight. That way, if drivers don't move away from them, they can jump onto the grass and out of the way. If you have no kids, be a role model when you're out running or walking your dog. And, don't be afraid to talk with other neighborhood children —or their parents--when you see them in unsafe situations.

Teach them not to cross the street near intersections or hills, to avoid cars they can't yet see. They need to look both ways, wait until no cars are in sight, then get across and out of the roadway quickly.

If they are on bikes, rollerblades, skateboards, scooters, ATVs or other open vehicles, be sure they know the rules of the road and the hazards of cars. Also, require helmets and other protective gear needed for the sport. We want to protect those precious heads when they fall or crash. Once injured, brain tissues heal slowly and often incompletely. If they complain, remind them: You are not replaceable.
