## **After the 2023 Spring Meeting**

The general meeting on May 20 in was attended in person by 9 Deerbrook members holding 2 proxies, so 11 households were represented. There were 45 paid Deerbrook households at the time of this meeting (one was paid at the meeting) so 9 households were required for a quorum and it was met for decision-making. After all outstanding payments, our balance on Deerbrook's account was \$2956.59.

The membership elected the following officers: Roger Hagan as President, Carl Deloney as Vice President, Blake Parkman as Treasurer, Claire Gloeckner as

Secretary, and Nicole Wright, Shannon Wood, Jeff Hubright, Fuentes. Rumenv Deanne Deloney, and Ed Stanley as board members. The membership also voted for a budget which included \$2679 for non-discretionary spending (front landscaping, electric bill, website, and tax filing) and \$900 discretionary spending (events, printing, and luminary supplies). This total of \$3579 is more than is currently in the bank, so we are relying on adding more members and/or donations to our coffers to make ends meet this year.

## **July 2 Fireworks!**

An estimated 50 people attended the fireworks display at the Windhurst cul-de-sac. Thanks especially to Blake Parkman, Jeff Hubright, Nicole Wright and the other members of the board who donated funds to keep us in

budget. In addition to \$300 budgeted by the membership in May, board members and an attending member donated \$281 such that the budget was flat for fireworks.
