Whoa! Was that Fire?!

You may have noticed that a fire occurred in Hasty Acres' property 4161 Nichols Court on August 22 around 1 pm. The fire department arrived very quickly. Station 3 came first, then Stations 22 and 9 arrived 2 minutes later, then Squad 20. More trucks arrived for a total of 3 fire engines, 1 ladder truck, 1 air & light truck, 1 squad truck, 1 EMS, 1 support truck & 2 battalion chiefs. This is normal for Gwinnett Fire. Most of this crew remained on

site for 2 hours, and there was one truck still there several hours later. This is great evidence that our fire department surely deserves the donations we give each year!

Channel 2 news reported that the fire was investigated as arson. Extensive damage occurred due to the fire and subsequent efforts to put it out, so expect there to be extensive work on that house to make it livable again.

Tree Removal Tips & Hints

Deerbrook is a community of trees – we all have them. The developer, John Wieland Homes, did not clear cut during construction which is why Deerbrook has so many nice trees. The subdivision is 40 years old now. Most of us living in Deerbrook will have a need to remove a tree. As the removal of trees is not just a danger to yourself and your property, but also to those of your neighbor, you should hire a professional to do the job. The following are a set of things to consider before making a commitment.

- 1) Get current documentation of their being licensed, insured and bonded.
- They should have excellent ratings from any site you check, including the BBB (Better Business Bureau) website, Angie's List, Craigslist, etc.
- 3) They should carry insurance. Liability insurance guarantees the company is legally responsible for any damage to your home (& others) or possessions. Worker's compensation insurance protects both you and the company's employees by covering any injury sustained while on your property.
- 4) Avoid companies that do not want to give an **estimate in writing**.
- An arborist can assist with dealing with storm damage or disease, and can provide information on the health of your trees as well.

- 6) Tall trees should not be cut from the base; a climber should cut down the tree in sections from the top. Downed tall trees create blocked roads (a safety hazard) and damage to nearby yards, curbs, and driveways.
- 7) You may have to pay extra to have the stumps removed or ground to less than 12" above the surrounding ground plane per Gwinnett County Property Maintenance ordinance Section 14-307. Trees. - 8) Make sure your service company includes removal of debris or do so yourself, as this is also required by the county per the above link: Tree Debris "Felled trees, slash, or removed tree limbs shall not be permitted or maintained on the ground on any premises for more than 14 days."
- 9) Southern Pines are shallow rooted conifers and when they begin to lean will eventually fall over. Check your yard and neighbors' yards for these potential problems. Once a tree has begun to lean it can quickly become unstable and get knocked over in a thunderstorm's high winds, causing damage and/or injury.
