What's the Deal with the Satellite Dishes?

Our covenants state that TV antennas and satellite dishes are to be mounted on the rear slope of the roof and can't be more than 6 feet above the highest slope of the roof. Unfortunately, for the sake of convenience, it seems our dishy providers like to stick them on the front of the roof, or in the ground right in front of the house next to the curb.

Maybe not all of them can go on the rear of the roof, but we rarely hear complaints about those that are set back from the street amongst the

bushes so that they don't jump out at people passing by.
