Home Repair Work: Who should you call? by Patricia Yeargin

It finally happens—the roof really needs to be replaced. It's an expensive job, and you can hardly even find the time to get an estimate. Then when you schedule the time, the appointees don't even show up. Has this ever happened to you?

On occasion, people email DHOA to find out if "we" recommend anyone for a particular type of repair work on homes. We've never had a systematic way to gather this kind of information, and probably, with our small size, never will.

There are services that review companies for a fee; for example, Angie's list charges \$49.00 per year to review and recommend all sorts of services. There is even a group that does it at no charge to the consumer. Since I've used it before, I'll share: www.homereports.com. You can go to their website and enter your zip, locate the type of work you need done, and look at their ratings. They won't name the badly reviewed people, for fear of legal reprisal, but they do list the good ones.

The downside is that sometimes the companies that are listed are overloaded, short staffed, and too busy to respond to you. I got one home repair service out to give estimates, but when I called them back to do some of the jobs, they didn't call me back for weeks. I finally gave up on them and called **Handy Andy**, recommended by a colleague. They do all kinds of jobs, large and small. Even with being called 3 weeks later, they had the work estimated and completed before the other company's proposed start date. And, at a better price.

So, that is my first recommendation. If you've worked with a local company for any kind of home improvement or repair, and you'd like to share your experience with your neighbors, let us know. We'll print it. No paid ads, though—just YOUR recommendation!
