Deerbrook Holiday Events: Dues & Luminaries 12/6

As in years past, we are again going to light up Deerbrook with luminaries. Luminaries will be handed out on Sunday, December 6 at Roger Hagen's house at 4015 Windhurst between 1 and 5 p.m. Please set out your luminaries, spaced about 10 feet apart, on your curb and light them at dusk. If it's rainy or windy, the luminaries will instead be set out December 13. Regardless of the weather, pickup is on December 6. To help defray the cost of the luminary supplies, we're asking for a donation of \$5. Prepare for luminaries by clearing leaves and debris out of the rain gutters by the roadside - taking care that the leaves don't end up down the storm drains, where they can block or slow down water flow (see article on next page).

2021 DHOA dues (\$60) will also be collected at Roger's house on December

6. Remember, these dues are used for general upkeep of the association which benefits all of us, including paying the bills for our beautiful landscaping, the electricity for our streetlights, our website, and office supplies like this newsletter.

Also on December 6, we will **collect contributions** for our local firehouse. In years past we have collected over a hundred dollars for each of the three shifts and we are very proud to be helping those who help us. Our firehouse personnel are superb professionals, as has been testified by several of our homeowners who have required their services. This year, we hope to surpass what we provided last year.

Time to Prepare for Winter

Storm drains are our responsibility. If you have a storm drain on your property, you may know that you, the resident, are responsible for keeping it clear. These drains are strictly for getting rainwater off the roads and keeping it from washing yards away. If you haven't picked up the dead debris from your yard since the recent storms, you may have some cleaning to do. Without regular cleaning the storm drains get clogged and sheets of water go all the way across the street. Please help keep waterways open and clear.

Winterize your external pipes. We have had several mild winters, but it is unwise to assume that this year will also be mild. Cover your external faucets with inexpensive styrofoam covers to prevent water freezing damage to them. Drain your sprinkler systems and turn them off for the season.

Sand for our entrance. Let's hope we don't need it, but we have a small stockpile of sand for our roads in case of slippery slopes. We've learned the hard way that snow melts into ice on a lot of our hilly, shaded streets. We also noticed there is no substitute for shoveling snow off the roads

(especially the hills) as soon as possible after it falls. We'll be looking for volunteers with shovels the next time that happens!

Stuck at home in a power outage. You should have extra supplies at home in case of power outages or other emergencies. The Centers for Disease Control has a very helpful emergency preparedness list at: http://emergency.cdc.gov/preparedness/kit/disasters/

On the road. Be sure to have your emergency kits ready for winter driving, too. If you must drive in wicked weather or when it's predicted, here are some ideas for what to have in your car. Flashlights and batteries, bottled water, jumper cables, some high-calorie non-perishable food (peanut butter, raisins, nuts, etc.), flares, first-aid kit, blanket, ice scraper, and a bag of sand, to name a few. Keep your cell phone charged, have a charger in your car, and keep your gas tank at least half full at all times.
