Streets and gutters: Residents are responsible for cleaning the gutters and street that adjoin their property. Roadside gutters must be kept clear at all times to allow for the free flow of rainwater. And, if a storm drain is on your property, it is your job to keep it clear as well. Anyone blowing leaves should blow them <u>away</u> from rain gutters and storm drains. **Curbside recycling:** We've found out more about what they *can't* use.

You **cannot** recycle any kind of Styrofoam at curbside. **No** carry-out cups or containers, **no** packing peanuts or polystyrene ice chests.

No light bulbs, mirrors, windows, broken glass, ceramics, or dishes.

No waxed cardboard or foil-lined cartons – no juice boxes or ice cream cartons.

No plastic bags or plastic film; the only plastics allowed are numbered containers that held non-toxic stuff.

No plastic-coated or foil lined paper (such as fancy wrapping paper).

recycle: plain paper, You can cardboard. paperboard, books. catalogs, magazines, aluminum cans, steel cans, numbered plastics, and clear glass of all colors. Questions? Call Waste Pro at 770.777.1447. (To learn to recycle things that can't go in the curbside bins, check online at earth911.com.)

Crime and Wildlife Watch: No crime reports, but coyotes and foxes have been spotted. Watch out for your pets – coyotes hunt in packs.
